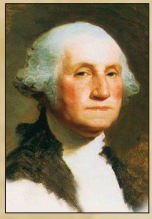
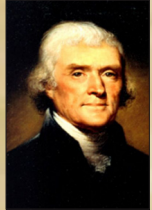


The Unanimous Declaration Of Dependence Upon Almighty God

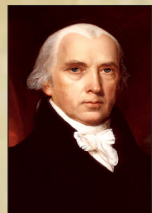

We the Founding Delegates of The First Continental Prayer Congress, convened at The Children's White House at Shawnee Twin Lakes, Oklahoma, on Flag Day, Sunday, June 14th, in the year of OUR LORD 2026, and in celebration of the 250th anniversary of our nation's founding; do, on behalf of Our Nation's Children, approve and adopt this "Unanimous Declaration of Dependence Upon Almighty God" which, by means of the following presidential quotes concerning God, the Bible and the Christian Faith, attest with one united voice to the undeniable religious foundations and spiritual heritage of the United States Of America.



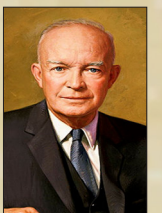
♦ **George Washington** "The propitious smiles of Heaven can never be expected upon a nation that disregards the eternal rules of order and right which Heaven itself has ordained." (First Inaugural Address - April 30, 1789) ♦ "Of all the dispositions and habits which lead to political prosperity, religion and morality are indispensable supports. In vain would that man claim the tribute of Patriotism, who should labor to subvert these great pillars of human happiness." (Farewell Address - September 19, 1796) ♦ **Thomas Jefferson** "God, who gave us life, gave us liberty, and can the liberties of the nation be thought secure when we have removed their only firm basis - a conviction in the minds of the people that these liberties are the gift of God? That they are not to be violated but with his wrath? Indeed, I tremble for my country when I reflect that God is just: and that his justice cannot sleep forever." ♦ **James Madison** "We have staked the whole future of American civilization, not upon the power of government, far from it. We have staked the future of all our political institutions upon the capacity of mankind for self-government; upon the capacity of each and all of us to govern ourselves, to control ourselves, to sustain ourselves according to the Ten Commandments of God. The future and success of America is not in this Constitution but in the laws of God upon which this Constitution is founded." (Madison, On The Future of America) ♦ **John Quincy Adams** "The highest glory of the American Revelation was this; that it connected in one indissoluble bond, the principles of civil government with the principles of Christianity." (July 4, 1821) ♦ **Andrew Jackson** "Providence has showered on this favored land blessings without number, and has chosen you as the guardians of freedom, to preserve it for the benefit of the human race. May he who holds in his hands the destinies of nations, make you worthy to guard and defend the great charge he has committed to your keeping." (March 4, 1837) ♦ Of the Bible, Jackson said, "That book, Sir, is the Rock on which our Republic rests." (June 8, 1845) ♦ **Abraham Lincoln** "It is the duty of nations as well as men to own their dependence upon the overruling power of God, and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all of history, that those nations only are blessed whose God is the LORD." (March 30, 1853) ♦ "I believe the Bible is the best gift that God has given to man. All the good Savior gave to the world was communicated through this book. But for this book, we could not know right from wrong. All things desirable for man's welfare, here and hereafter, are to be found portrayed in it." (Sept. 5, 1854)



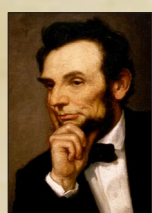
♦ **Theodore Roosevelt** "Every thinking man, when he thinks, realizes that the teachings of the Bible are so interwoven and intertwined with our whole civic and social life that it would be literally, I do not mean figuratively, but literally impossible for us to figure what the loss would be if these teachings were removed. We would lose almost all standards by which we now judge both public and private morals; all standards toward which we, with more or less resolution, strive to raise ourselves." (1909) ♦ "It is my great joy and glory that, in occupying an exalted position in the nation, I am enabled to preach the practical moralities of the Bible to my fellow countrymen and to hold up Christ as the hope and Savior of the world. I believe that the next half century will determine if we will advance the cause of Christian civilization or revert to the horrors of brutal paganism. The choice between the two is now upon us." (1910) ♦ **Woodrow Wilson** "The Bible is the one supreme source of the meaning of life, the nature of God, and the spiritual nature and needs of men. It is the only guide of life which really leads the spirit in the way of peace and salvation. America was born a Christian nation. America was born to exemplify that devotion to the elements of righteousness which are derived from the revelations of Holy Scripture." July 4, 1915 ♦ **Calvin Coolidge** "The foundations of our society and our government rest so much on the teachings of the Bible, that it would be difficult to support them if faith in these teachings would cease to be practically universal in our country. If American democracy is to remain the greatest hope of humanity, it must continue abundantly in the faith of the Bible." (May 3, 1925) ♦ **Franklin D. Roosevelt** "In reference to Christmas said: "Peace on earth, good will toward men', democracy must cling to that message. For it is my deep conviction that democracy cannot live without that true religion which gives us a sense of justice and moral purpose." (Oct. 28, 1944) ♦ **Harry S. Truman** "The fundamental basis of this nation's laws was given to Moses on the Mount. The fundamental basis of our Bill of Rights comes from the teachings of Exodus and St. Matthew, from Isaiah and St. Paul. I don't think we emphasize that enough these days. If we don't have a proper fundamental moral background, we will finally end up with a totalitarian government which does not believe in rights for anybody but the state." ♦ **Dwight D. Eisenhower** "Without God, there could be no American form of government, nor an American way of life. Recognition of the Supreme Being is the first, the most basic expression of Americanism." ♦ When adding the words, "Under God" from Lincoln's Gettysburg Address, to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance, Eisenhower said: "In this way we are reaffirming the transcendence of religious faith in America and shall constantly strengthen those spiritual weapons which forever will be our country's most powerful resource in peace and war." (May 14, 1954) ♦ **Ronald Reagan** "Without God, there is no virtue, because there is no prompting of the conscience. Without God, we're mired in the material, that flat world that tells us only what our senses perceive. Without God there is a coarsening of society. And without God democracy will not and cannot long endure. If we ever forget that we are one nation under God, then we will be a nation gone under."
